'material' side of parish life - making sure that everything is in good working order so that the Vicar is freed up to care for the congregation and its worship. That's the principle at least! Finally, to support those three we then have nine other PCC members who each bring their own talents to the table. And the discussions are not just about drains and hall bookings! St James' is embarking on an exciting five year plan 'Phase 2' which will build on all the work of refurbishing our buildings and updating our admin. infrastructure, begun in 2011. Key to that is the use of the Church - in particular our innovative series of concerts and musical events - and the care of our children and our younger families.

YOUNG PEOPLE IN CHURCH At the end of the AGM Maria Burniston raised the question of how best to serve our young people on 1st Sundays. Traditionally this has been an All Age Mass but this has not always been appreciated by parents looking after very young (and wriggly) children. As a result we are running a questionnaire over the next couple of months to see what the whole congregation

would prefer on these occasions. In July the PCC will sit down with all the responses to see what would be best: to stay as we are now, to develop a more inter-active Mass or provide Sunday School as usual.

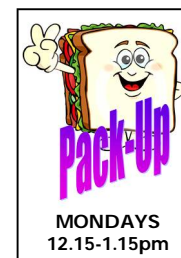

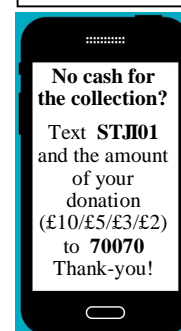
