APPEAL FOR SHELTER FROM **THE STORM** This charity provides overnight accommodation and practical support for homeless people. It started life as a joint venture between St James' Church and St John the Evangelist RC church in Duncan Terrace. St James' Church Hall became one of the overnight shelters. The project rapidly outgrew the avail-

able accommodation and is now located in a small industrial estate in Blundell Street between Caledonian Road and York Way. The Shelter benefits from the Pret a Manger scheme for donating perishable snacks to homeless charities at the end of the day. Volunteers collect the food from Pret in St John Street just south of the Angel at 9 pm on a weekday evening and take it to the Shelter. They are looking for a couple more volunteers to join the weekly rota. I have been doing it for many years and it takes me about an hour maximum round trip by car from my house near the Angel.
