

MACMILLAN WELL-BEING COACHING

As some of you know, our daughter Catriona works for Macmillan Cancer. She has been part of the team which has set up a scheme aimed at helping those suffering from cancer to approach the future by changing negative thoughts into more positive ones. They offer a six week telephone course with skilled trainers whose aims are to:

- Better understand what's on your mind and come to terms with your life with or after cancer.
- Build confidence to talk with a loved one about what you're going through and how they can support you.
- Develop coping strategies for challenging situations you find yourself in.
- Build courage to be around other people and to communicate with them.
- Find new opportunities for work, study or leisure that interest you.
- Learn to feel OK with making mistakes and become more able to move forward.

PCC MEETING Our PCC had it's first (zoom) meeting on Thursday - since January! One of our first tasks was to look at what the shut-down of the church will mean financially. The lack of hiring out of our premises was the most serious challenge and Susan Sorensen estimates that we may lose up to £50,000 in the course of this year. Nevertheless we feel obliged to pay our full Common Fund to the Diocese which pays for our clergy and we are fortunate that giving by the congregation has gone up this year and we have some historic assets we can call on. But it is going to be tough and we do hope that people will do all they can to see us through this very difficult time. Sinead talked about the three new initiatives that have developed since March 24th. In addition to the transformation of the Arena newsletter into a weekly bulletin, there has also been the development of a Sunday streamed services on YouTube. These now involve a large number of the congregation who are prepared to record parts of the service at home. She also talked about the weekly craft packs for our 40 Sunday School children. But we all agreed that all these things can only be second-best to being part of a worshipping community and we looked forward to that very much indeed. Everyone said how much they were missing being part of a lively Church family.



TRAFFIC IN ST PETER'S WARD Clare Cornell and Jane Kilgannon both sent in details of a new survey designed to ask the Council to consider traffic calming measures locally: Clare writes: I'm sure you will agree that since the lock down the area has been so much nicer due to the reduced volume of traffic. We have a much better chance of getting Islington Council to make changes at the moment so we are keen to get as many views and as much support from local residents as possible. We've set up a website www.StPeters2020.org which includes a survey about the area. It would be fantastic if you could fill in the survey and share it with others in the neighbourhood who you think would be interested. Having support from St James' would be very much appreciated.
