JACK CARTER, starting in year 7 at St Mary Magdalene CE Academy, is not the only young person wondering what lies in store for him this term. For all of our children, the months off school have changed the age-old school-going habit, forcing students and parents alike to find ways to learn together - sometimes, but not always, supported by materials sent in by teachers and by web-based learning on whatever computer is available at home. The closure of schools has inevitably altered the relationship between parents and their children, the ongoing friendships children make at school - and of course the serious matter of how parents can be enabled to go out to work.

And what will our children find when they are back in the classroom? Will the measures to ensure social distancing mean that schools won't feel quite the same? Creating bubbles for year groups and making arrangements for playtimes and lunch breaks have all required hours of careful planning.

On this **Education Sunday** we pray for all the challenges being faced by teachers and by our young people. But in the light of the pandemic we also ask: what is education all about? Is it mostly about acquiring lots of knowledge or is it, as Proverbs tells us, 'the gaining of wisdom'? And does that apply every bit as much to us as it does to our children?

SEPTEMBER has arrived with a vengeance and it is good to feel a new energy after such a long period of inactivity. First and foremost we are delighted that Pack-Up is starting again this week but there have also been lots of enquiries about concerts, rehearsals (and yet more filming). These all require risk assessments but we are delighted that choirs and music groups are wanting to return. In a fortnight we will be beginning a new First Holy Communion programme and on Monday evening the Church Council convenes for the last time before our Annual General Meeting on October 25th. On the Agenda: a catch up on the impact of Covid on our finances, news of the welcome offer of help with Building and Maintenance from Jay Wilson, and, hopefully, an update on the Organ Project which has been hanging fire since April. And then there is the question of what we will be able to do at Christmas...

ARC It is good to be building a closer relationship with the ARC in St Paul Street and their Food Bank is going from strength to strength. We are very keen to support their distribution to over 60 local families. As a fund raiser Epiphoni, one of the very best choral groups in London, are performing here at St James' at 6pm on Sunday 27th September. For obvious reasons numbers are limited but reservations can now be made via the Vicarage.

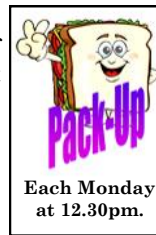
IN HOSPITAL We pray for Revd Melanie Toogood (St James' Close) who is currently resident in the Mildmay undergoing rehabilitation.

PRISONERS OF CONSCIENCE We continue to pray for the urgent release of **Nazanin Zaghari-Radcliffe** from custody in Iran. After last week's Panorama programme it seems certain that her detention is linked to the unpaid debt over tanks bought by, but not delivered to, the Iranians back in the 1970s. We pray for her husband Richard and their daughter Gabriella in London, now 6. The news about **Kylie Moore-Gilbert** (left) is even more difficult. She has recently been sent to the notorious Qarchak prison, deep in the Iranian desert with no clean running water, where food is regularly drugged and prisoners are subject to beatings from warders and detainees alike. She has not had regular contact with her family and she admits to being 'in a very bad place', sleeping on the floor with not enough money to buy essentials. She has been held since September 2018.
