Organ

The decision made at the Parish AGM in April to go ahead with the rebuilding of our organ was only one stage of a very complicated proposal. Throughout the Spring a small PCC working party has been working hard to assess all the options available, with the help of advisers from the Diocese. But the physical task of turning the pipework by 90 degrees - which will make the most difference to the final sound - is by no means straightforward. It has not been helped by the recent departure of the organ builder for Singapore where he is completing the restoration of the Cathedral organ there. Please pray that all the various bits of the jigsaw will come together in time to be approved by not only our PCC but also the Diocese, and that we can find the funding to make it all possible.
