**LOOK THE OTHER WAY!** Today's Gospel is one of the best of the Resurrection stories. The disciples had been fishing all night - and caught nothing. They are just about to give up when they meet Jesus. He asks them how they have been doing and they admit they have caught nothing all night. His advice? To throw their nets on the other side of the boat. But they were dead tired and the temptation would have been to ignore Jesus altogether. After all he wasn't a fisherman, how would he know? But something persuades Peter, the leader of the group to take the risk. And we all remember the result: the nets are so heavy with fish they nearly break.

Last Sunday we were able to baptise Evie Jenkins. It was a lovely occasion but nothing particularly out of the ordinary. And yet afterwards, a total stranger came up and asked to be baptised. Something in the service had touched her and she knew that now was the time to make this commitment of faith. That will mean we will be running two Basic Christianity course for two adults who have decided to take the plunge, responding to Jesus' call to 'look the other way'. This is immensely exciting - as is the start, today, of a new programme for some of our older young people who want to make their First Holy Communion in June. Taking the plunge, trying something new; listening to what Jesus has to share with us. If that doesn't encourage us in our 'Time to Dream' process, I don't what will!

**Glory to you, O Lord**

(St John 21: 1-14 CEV) Once more Jesus showed himself again to the disciples, this time by the Sea of Tiberias.

Sitting by their boats were Simon Peter, Thomas (called the Twin), Nathanael of Cana, the two sons of Zebedee, and two other disciples. Simon Peter said, 'I am going fishing' and they all said that they would go with him. But that night they caught nothing.

Just as the day was breaking, Jesus stood on the beach; but the disciples did not know that it was Jesus. Jesus said to them, 'What happened? You haven't caught any fish!'

Pointing to the boat, he said, 'Try again, but this time throw your net from the other side of the boat, on the right hand side'. They did as he told them but this time they could not pull the net back into the boat because it was so full of fish.

Then the disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, 'It is the Lord!' When Simon Peter looked again that it was the Lord, he put some clothes on and jumped into the lake. The other disciples followed, dragging the heavy net behind them. The boat was only a hundred metres from the shore.

When the fishermen had jumped out of their boats they saw a charcoal fire burning on the beach. On the fire the fish laid been laid out to cook and there was a loaf of bread there too. Jesus said to them, 'Bring some of the fish that you have just caught.' Simon Peter went aboard and hauled the net ashore, full of large fish. There were a hundred and fifty-three of them and although there were so many, the net did not break .

Jesus said to them, 'Come and have breakfast.' Now none of the disciples dared to ask him, 'Who are you?' because they knew it was the Lord. Jesus came and took the bread and gave it to them, and did the same with the fish. This was now the third time that Jesus appeared to the disciples after he was raised from the dead.
