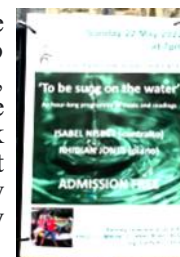

WELCOME TODAY TO THE 2022 ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

This is our first major meeting since virtually all pandemic restrictions have been lifted and so we look together at how we are faring 'after Covid' and what we need to put in place for the years leading up to our 150th celebrations in 2025.

The are two parts to the meeting: the first is the election of our Churchwardens and I am delighted to say that both Isabel and

Hilary have agreed to stand again - which gives us the opportunity to thank them so very much for their care and commitment to the life and ministry of St James'.

After that we will quickly look at the current state of our finances and then, with the help of the screen, we will look at a pictorial 'Review of the Year', which will be for two years as Covid prevented us from doing this last year.

Hopefully this will encourage us to go on to ask the key question: 'WWYD?' (*what will you do*) as we appeal for volunteers to help us maintain—and develop—our work here at St James'. We have just eighteen months before the interregnum (the period between parish priests) and we need to be in good heart before that.

There are also some decisions to be made: the first is the use of some of the bequest given by Jill Hetherington last year. The PCC are proposing to have the pews repaired and re-stained at a cost of about £3,500. The second is to decide whether we should restore the sharing of the chalice or continue to administer communion by intinction. These need to be decided at this AGM.

ASCENSION SUNDAY 'MUSICAL VESPERS' After today the Easter Garden is removed from Church and we begin to look towards the Ascension of Christ which we keep on Sunday May 29th with the traditional release of a helium balloon after the 10am Mass. That evening we are also holding a Musical Vespers put together by Sergio Munoz (who organised the successful Lent Film Series). He has translated a sequence of beautiful meditations and chosen some powerful pictures for use in the service and of course there will be some good music too. The service starts at 6.30pm.

TRIP TO SOUTHWARK CATHEDRAL AND GREENWICH Look out for details of the ecumenical trip to Southwark on Saturday June 11th which will also include an optional ride on the Thames and picnic in Greenwich - all free!


