THE GOOD SAMARITAN Like all of Jesus' stories, the parable of the Good Samaritan stands being told umpteen times. And it always has new things to reveal as we try to match our experience of life with the call to follow Christ. The hectic events of this week - politically - are just one prism through which to look again at this very familiar piece of teaching. And one of the many question that keeps coming to mind is: what has another person's misfortunes got to do with me...?

CYRIL We were all enormously sorry to hear of the death of Cyril Daley on Friday 1st July. Cyril had been part of the Montserrat community within St James' for very many years - although his accent was never that easy to understand! He was a fine ringer of the sanctuary bell at our Sunday 10am Mass and had been acting as a carer for his mother Catherine, our oldest resident. After a long period on dialysis Cyril had been able to get a kidney transplant but recently this had begun to fail and his last weeks in the Royal Free were not very comfortable. Most of his children live in Sheffield but his friends and other members of his family are in London. Funeral details to come.



COVID After being largely Covid free since March 2020, this latest variant has hit us hard at St James' as all the Vicarage family as well as Isabel Nisbet had succumbed to the virus over the last three weeks. Thanks to Fr Stephen for covering our Masses at very short notice last Sunday. We are also sorry that we have had to cancel Sunday School for three weeks - and postpone the big Summer Party in the Vicarage garden planned for today. It was just too big a risk planning a party when still testing positive! I hope we can set a new date at the end of the summer. Despite my incapacity, congratulations to Maria and Sinead Burniston who managed to host the annual NGS Open Gardens last Sunday, providing refreshment for nearly 150 people! The gardens looked beautiful and £380 was raised from the refreshments - and about £2,000 from ticket sales to seven local gardens. It is really important that all our buildings (Church, Hall, and Vicarage) are able to be put at the service of the wider local community.

THANKS One of the great joys over the last seven months has been having a really good Church cleaner! Tommy McDonnell has done a fantastic job. Sadly he

moves on after this week but it does remind me to ask for your help in keeping the Church as tidy as possible. With so many things for people to enjoy in the south aisle it can very easily look scruffy!

The Word of God

1st Reading: (Deuteronomy 30: 9-14) The Lord your God will make you abundantly prosperous in all your undertakings, in the fruit of your body, in the fruit of your livestock, and in the fruit of your soil. For the Lord will again take delight in prospering you, just as he delighted in prospering your ancestors, when you obey the Lord your God by observing his commandments and decrees that are written in this book of the law, because you turn to the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul.

Surely, this commandment that I am commanding you today is not too hard for you, nor is it too far away. It is not in heaven, that you should say, 'Who will go up to heaven for us, and get it for us so that we may hear it and observe it?' Neither is it beyond the sea, that you should say, 'Who will cross to the other side of the sea for us, and get it for us so that we may hear it and observe it?' No, the word is very near to you; it is in your mouth and in your heart for you to observe.

Just as it is bearing fruit and growing in the whole world, so it has been bearing fruit among yourselves from the day you heard it and truly comprehended the grace of God. This you learned from Epaphras, our beloved fellow-servant. He is a faithful minister of Christ on your behalf, and he has made known to us your love in the Spirit. For this reason, since the day we heard it, we have not ceased praying for you and asking that you may be filled with the knowledge of God's will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding, so that you may lead lives worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing to him, as you bear fruit in every good work and as you grow in the knowledge of God. May you be made strong with all the strength that comes from his glorious power, and may you be prepared to endure everything with patience, while joyfully giving thanks to the Father, who has enabled you to share in the inheritance of the saints in the light. He has rescued us from the power of darkness and transferred us into the kingdom of his beloved Son, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins.

Glory to you, O Lord.

(St Luke 10: 25-37) Just then a lawyer stood up to test Jesus. 'Teacher,' he said, 'what must I do to inherit eternal life?' He said to him, 'What is written in the law? What do you read there?' He answered, 'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbour as yourself.' And he said to him, 'You have given the right answer; do this, and you will live.'

But wanting to justify himself, he asked Jesus, 'And who is my neighbour?' Jesus replied, 'A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, and fell into the hands of robbers, who stripped him, beat him, and went away, leaving him half dead. Now by chance a priest was going down that road; and when he saw him, he passed by on the other side. So likewise a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. But a Samaritan while travelling came near him; and when he saw him, he was moved with pity. He went to him and bandaged his wounds, having poured oil and wine on them. Then he put him on his own animal, brought him to an inn, and took care of him. The next day he took out two denarii, gave them to the innkeeper, and said, "Take care of him; and when I come back, I will repay you whatever more you spend." Which of these three, do you think, was a neighbour to the man who fell into the hands of the robbers?' He said, 'The one who showed him mercy.' Jesus said to him, 'Go and do likewise.'






