**ANTHONY HILL** As the Organ Project reaches its last stages of completion, the name of Anthony Hill - who sadly died six years ago this week - rightly comes to mind. Anthony was our organist for a little under three years but in that time he made a huge contribution to the musical life of this parish. As well as being a key supporter of the Islington Proms in its early days, it was Anthony who drove out to Rayleigh in Essex to secure the Bechstein grand piano which has made it possible for so many people to rehearse and perform at St James'. But he was also part of the pool of fine musicians who

advised us how best to restore our Gray and Davison organ as we put forward proposals to the Diocesan Advisory Committee. His death very shortly after our 140th anniversary celebrations led to the setting up of an annual concert in his memory as part of the Islington Proms. But I am also delighted that one of his organ compositions, Toccata Eroica, will be performed by Charlie Andrews at the opening recital of the new organ on 20th November 2022. This will follow a full Choral Evensong sung by Epiphoni. I think Anthony would have been delighted by how well things have worked out - all these years later!



PARISH MASS  
FOR ST JAMES' DAY 2022

*The Church is in darkness and the congregation sit in silence.  
The Paschal Candle burns in the middle of the assembly.*

You, O Lord, are my lamp;  
**you turn our darkness into light**  
Let us give thanks to the Lord our God  
**who is worthy of all thanksgiving and praise.**

Welcome to St James' and to this special day in the life of our parish when we welcome Mohammad, Arnold, Hope, Matteo, Theo, Zuri and Anita to the Table of the Lord for the first time. This comes at the end of their time preparing for this moment, reflecting on the Bible and learning about the traditions of the Church.

Most of all they have begun to understand what it is to 'build Church': talking and laughing, playing and thinking with and alongside one another. And they have begun to understand the meaning of Jesus' call to leave old habits behind so that his wonderful love and power can work inside them. They know that this is what each Holy Communion is designed to do - to help them grow in faith and love so that the light of Christ can be seen more perfectly in them.

So let us 'act out' the journey that they have taken. While Isabel sings our opening hymn, we ask the four candidates and their parents to come and stand with me at the Font, the place where we start our Christian journey.

*The Sanctuary party, the First Communicants and their parents go to the Font*

Entry Hymn: **CG21 Longing for light**

**Longing for light, we wait in darkness.  
Longing for truth, we turn to you.  
Make us your own, your holy people,  
light for the world to see.  
Christ, be our light!

**Many the gifts, many the people,

Here at the Font we remember the story of Moses. We recall how God saved his people at the Red Sea and helped them to cross to safety. When they complained he also fed them with manna in the desert so that they would not starve.

God continues to feed us and care for us even when we ignore his voice and protest about those things which we find difficult. His life-giving and eternal food is offered to us as a pledge of his constant love. As a sign of thanksgiving for that love, let us call to mind our sins and ask to be washed clean.

**Loving Lord, we are your people:  
young and old, tall and small, strong and weak.  
All of us, Lord, get things wrong  
and all of us need to be forgiven -  
by you, and by each other.**

**Now, in your presence, we admit what we have done  
and accept our share of the hurts in the world;  
the pride, the fights, the unfairness and the waste.**

**We declare today that we are truly sorry  
and we promise to try harder.  
Make us willing to forgive each other  
more easily and more often.  
Remind us that we are called  
to love without counting the cost,  
knowing that only then are we doing your will. Amen.**

May the God of love bring us back to himself, forgive us our sins and assure us of his eternal love, in Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

*The candidates are sprinkled with the clean water of the Font. After the Absolution the candidates return to their places.*

*Copy those who are kind and generous and you will find that the God of love will fill you with love and contentment.*



**Glory to you, O Lord.**

((St Matthew 20: 20-28 CEV) Then the mother of two of Jesus' disciples, James and John, came to Jesus and asked him a question. She said to him, 'Will you promise that these two sons of mine will be seated in the very best places in heaven - one on your right hand and one on your left?'

Jesus answered her, 'I am afraid you do not understand what you are asking for'. Turning to the disciples he asked them, 'Are you willing to work with me and then suffer as I am about to suffer?' They said to him, 'We are willing to do all these things.' Jesus said to them, 'You are right; you will share my work and you will die as I am about to do. But even then none of us knows who has been given those special places in heaven. Only my Father knows these things.'

When the rest of the disciples heard what James and John's mother had asked they were angry with the two brothers. But Jesus called them to him and said, 'You know that all the important people in this world like to force other people to do what they want. They bully those around them and force them to obey.

But it must not be like that with you. It tell you, whoever wants to be great among you must become your servant and whoever wants to be at the head of the queue must be content to stand at the back. This is how you follow me: for the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life so that others could live.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, O Christ.**

### The Address

*Afterwards Mohammad, Arnold, Hope, Matteo, Theo, Zuri and Anita stand in the centre of the Church. One of their parents or carers stands behind them. The priest continues:*

Today is a very special day in each of your lives. Ever since you were young we have treated you as full members of the family of Jesus Christ.

The time has now come for you to mark a new stage in your life. Supported by those you love and encouraged by the prayers of this community of St James', I am inviting you to accept Jesus' invitation to receive him in Holy Communion.

This great privilege which we share as Christians will, for each of you, be part of your preparation for the gifts given in Confirmation and I pray that this Church will do all in its power to support you, by word and example, that you may come to adult faith and commitment at some time in the future.

So I ask you all: do you wish to receive Jesus in Holy Communion?

**I do.**

Will you try to copy the example of Jesus, listening to his voice both here and outside this Church?

**I will.**

*Each First Communicant is then presented with a certificate:*

N. I admit you as a communicant member of the Church. May Jesus nourish you with faith and love for ever. **Amen.**

*They are then given a small cross with these words:*

N., receive this Cross. May the Lord bless your ears, that you may hear his Word. May the Lord bless your eyes, that you may see his light. May the Lord bless your lips, that you may respond to his love. May the Lord bless your heart, that he may dwell there for ever. May the Lord bless your shoulders, that you may carry his cross and live always by its saving power. **Amen.**

*Afterwards the First Communicants return to their seats.*

*Prayers of Intercession follow, ending with the Collect which we say together*

*Collect:* **Heavenly Father, by the power of your Holy Spirit you give to your faithful people grace and power, and at this table feed us with your love in Holy Communion: grant that we may offer our lives to you now and shine with your light all the days of our life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.**

*We stand for the Peace*

The Kingdom of God is not just a matter of eating and drinking, but of love, justice and joy in the Holy Spirit.

The peace of the Lord be always with you.

**And also with you.**

*We offer one another a sign of peace.*

*The candidates go to the back of the Church and bring up the Offertory elements and the money collected to increase the work of the Church.*


Jesus blessed you, Father, for the food, took bread, broke it, gave it and said: Take, eat, this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.
