
### PICTURES ARE EASIER THAN WORDS

Another busy few days in the varied



pattern that is St James'! Last Sunday we were really delighted to welcome John Wilson from Grace Church, Alvin in Texas - our link Church in the US. While John had studied in London this was his first trip to Islington. After a tour of the parish we treated him to a traditional pub Sunday lunch in the Hanbury. Carlos and Andres, our

painters and decorators, followed up their transformation of the pews with some remedial work on the altar frontals chest at the back of Church (and also the Churchwardens staves!) with a much needed repainting of the Church external doors. This was preceded by a long stint clearing all the weeds along the north side of the Church and down into the boiler house, another item to be added to the regular building and maintenance list! The Church was comfortably full for the funeral of Cyril Daley. It was a real Montserrat occasion but we will also miss Cyril for his faithfulness, for his ringing of the sanctuary bell and for his dry sense of humour. Finally congratulations to the Proms organising committee for attracting a really good sponsorship deal with Savills for the Islington Proms which start on Friday September 9th.



As most of you know I have developed rather fast growing cataracts recently and am now almost entirely 'print blind'. With magnifying glasses and the habits built up over 39 years, of producing Weekly News' and pew sheets, I have been able to get by so far but it may be that these will have to be curtailed. **LAMBETH CONFERENCE** Approximately every ten years since 1867, the 1000 or more bishops of the Anglican communion are invited to spend two weeks together - for prayer, mutual support and for a review of the challenges which face the Church in each generation. Unlike such meetings in the Roman Catholic Church, the purpose is not to thrash out new policies or to force some kind of uniformity over provinces which are so utterly different from one another. But the hope is that by spending time together, the issues which inevitably hit the head lines will be discussed by friends and colleagues rather than by distant and disinterested names on an anonymous agenda sheet. In today's sermon we look back over the work of Lambeth Conferences since 1867.

**WW DO?** Just before the summer break I wrote to Bishop Joanne to book a Confirmation service for 2023. We already have two candidates and I am hopeful that we might encourage others who have been admitted to First Communion over the years to think about being Confirmed. But we also might see if people would like to dip into bits of the Confirmation course when it touches on topics that interest them. See the leaflet at the back of Church for details.

### The Word of God

*1st Reading:* (Nehemiah 8: 1-17 CEV) On the second day, the heads of all the ancestral houses, together with their families, the priests and the Levites, came together in order to study the Word of the Lord. All the people gathered together in the square before the Water Gate and the scribe Ezra stood on a wooden platform that had been made for the purpose so that all the men and women could understand the interpretation that Ezra gave. Then Ezra blessed the Lord, the great God, and all the people answered, 'Amen, Amen'. There was very great rejoicing in that place as, day by day, from the first day to the last day, Ezra read from the book of the law of God. They kept the festival for seven days; and on the eighth day there was an even more solemn assembly. Then Ezra said: 'This day is holy to the Lord your God; be at peace and go on your way.' This is the Word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**
