(St Matthew 16: 21-end) From that time on, Jesus began to show his disciples that he must go to Jerusalem and undergo great suffering at the hands of the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and on the third day be raised. And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him, saying, 'God forbid it, Lord! This must never happen to you.' But he turned and said to Peter, 'Get behind me, Satan! Great is the mystery of faith.


When we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim your death, Lord Jesus, until you come again.

We bring before you this bread and this cup and thank you for counting us worthy to stand in your presence and serve you.




