Leaving each area of our life in good shape has been the priority over the last few months and I am so glad that God has continued to encourage people to take on the roles necessary to keep the Church running well. Organiser in chief has been Churchwarden *Isabel Nisbet*. She has been in closest touch with the Diocese and she has also chaired the team writing the Parish Profile, the document which we hope will attract the very best person to come as the next Vicar. Many people have contributed to the text and it has been edited by *Kip Meek*. *Emma Crampton*, a very new member of the congregation, has arrived in the nick of time to help with the layout and design.



Vicky Bellamy our Parish Administrator has been a great support over the last eighteen months. In addition to her work alongside Susan Sorensen and Tim Willis keeping track of our finances, Vicky now takes over responsibility for the booking of the Church. With over 100 new bookings in 2023 (raising over £16,500) this is a crucial part of our income stream. Vicky will also oversee the move of the Parish Office from the Vicarage to the Hall in Prebend Street. To manage the physi-

cal care of the buildings themselves *Sharon McPherson* has recently joined the admin. team. Sharon will not only keep the Church open but also take on the supplies and repairs portfolio. Churches are like the Forth Bridge: there is always something that needs to be fixed!
