After the service, the Archdeacon has agreed to have a discussion with the congregation about future plans for St James'. This is an important opportunity to be involved in planning for our future, so please note this date and do come if you possibly can.

Ash Wednesday, Wednesday 14 February

In previous years we have had an opportunity on the Sunday after Ash Wednesday for people to be signed with ashes to mark the beginning of Lent. This year we are offering a morning Mass (at 9am) on Ash Wednesday itself, and we hope that those who are available then will come.
